3) Loudonville Jr. High School (LJHS) has received the 2016 Making Middle Grades Work (MMGW) Top Performing School Recognition for exceeding all schools nationally on the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) 2016 MMGW Student and Teacher Surveys. LJHS students indicated that the school has an intensive emphasis in Science Curriculum, Engaging Science and Extra Help.

Seventy-one LJHS eighth grade students participated in the 2016 MMGW Student Survey, along with 30,702 eighth-grade students from 242 schools in the SREB MMGW Network. SREB works with its 16 member states to improve public education at every level, from early childhood through doctoral education. Ohio joined the SREB High Schools That Work (HSTW) network in 1998 and the MMGW network in 2002.

4) Loudonville High School (LHS) has received the 2016 High Schools That Work (HSTW) Top Performing School in NE Ohio Region. This recognition is based on the performance of LHS 2016 graduates on the national 2016 HSTW Student Survey. LHS exceeded all schools nationally and was a top performing school in HSTW NE Ohio Region in providing students with an intensive emphasis in Extra Help.

Thirty-seven LHS 12th grade students participated in the survey, along with 24,221 students in 16 member states in the Southern Regional Education Board's HSTW national network. WHEREAS, Agenda Item No. 16-70, carried by majority vote of the Board on July 11, 2016, conditionally provided for the hiring of Troy Stimpert as an elementary teacher (Grade 4 Math and Science) on a one-year limited contract for the 2016-2017 school year at a salary of \$32,735 (BA Step 0), contingent upon Mr. Stimpert providing all required pre-employment documents and test scores.

WHEREAS, Mr. Stimpert has not yet received a teacher license from the Ohio Department of Education, a pre-employment condition to being hired as a teacher.

WHEREAS, without the required licensure, the Teacher's Limited Contract between the Board of Education of Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District of Loudonville, Ohio and Troy Stimpert (Attached as Exhibit "A") has no legal effect pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 3319.30 and Ohio state law.

WHEREAS, Mr. Stimpert was awarded a 1 Year Long Term Substitute Middle Childhood (4-9) License from the State of Ohio Department of Education, for the Teaching Fields of Science and Social Studies, effective July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. (Attached hereto as Exhibit "B").

WHEREAS, Mr. Stimpert's services as a substitute teacher were needed from the dates of August 22, 2016 through November 9, 2016, and Mr. Stimpert provided those needed services for the Board.

WHEREAS, Mr. Stimpert is entitled to compensation for the substitute services provided in the District from August 22, 2016 through November 9, 2016, and has already been compensated in the amount of \$6,295.20 for the work days he has performed as a substitute teacher, which compensation reflects the special circumstances of the substitute assignment and exceeds the statutory minimum salary

for substitute services provided for under Ohio Revised Code 3319.10 for all days of service.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village Board of Education that Agenda Item No. 16-70, approved on July 11, 2016, and the corresponding Teacher's Limited Contract (Exhibit "A") are hereby rescinded.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village Board of Education that the hiring of Troy Stimpert as a substitute teacher effective August 22, 2016 through November 9, 2016, and the related compensation of \$6,295.20 for the work days performed as a substitute teacher are hereby declared a proper public use of funds and are therefore ratified and approved by the Board.
